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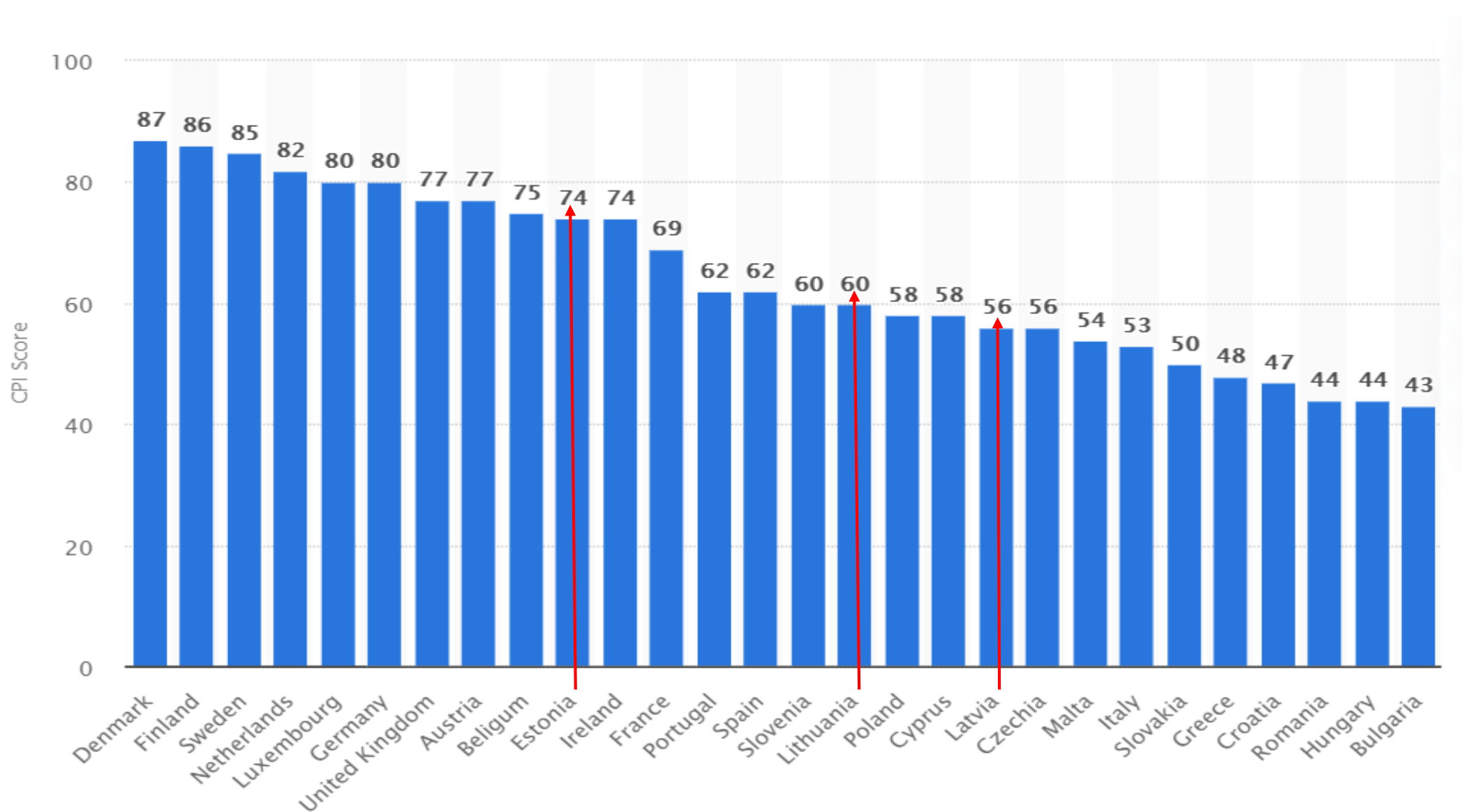

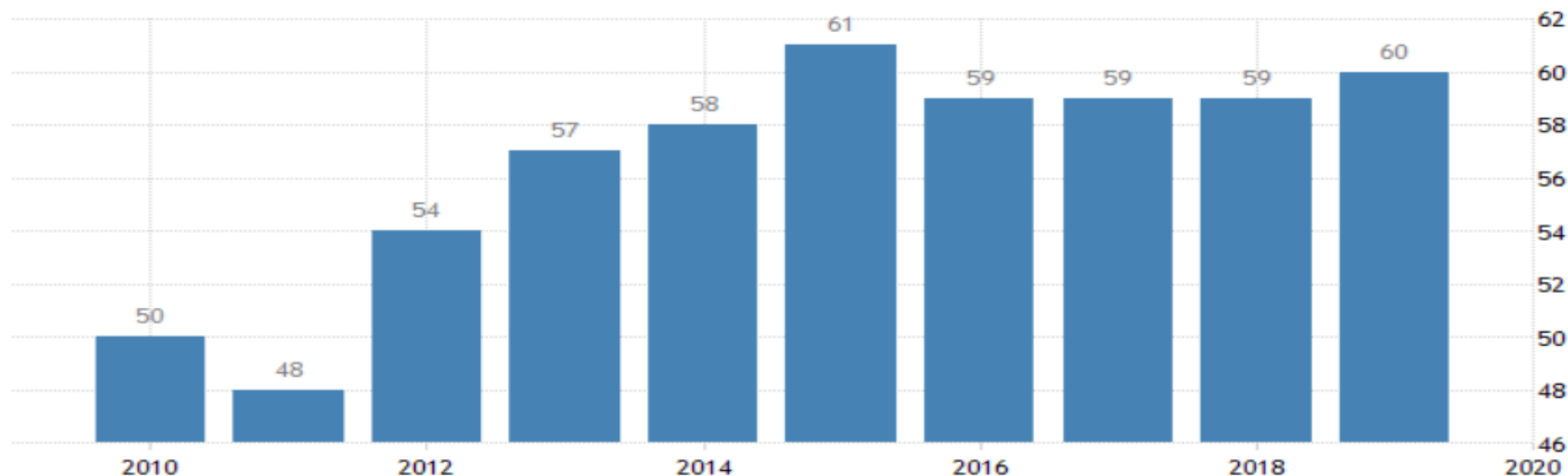

Lithuania in CPI 2019 (Corruption Perception Index)



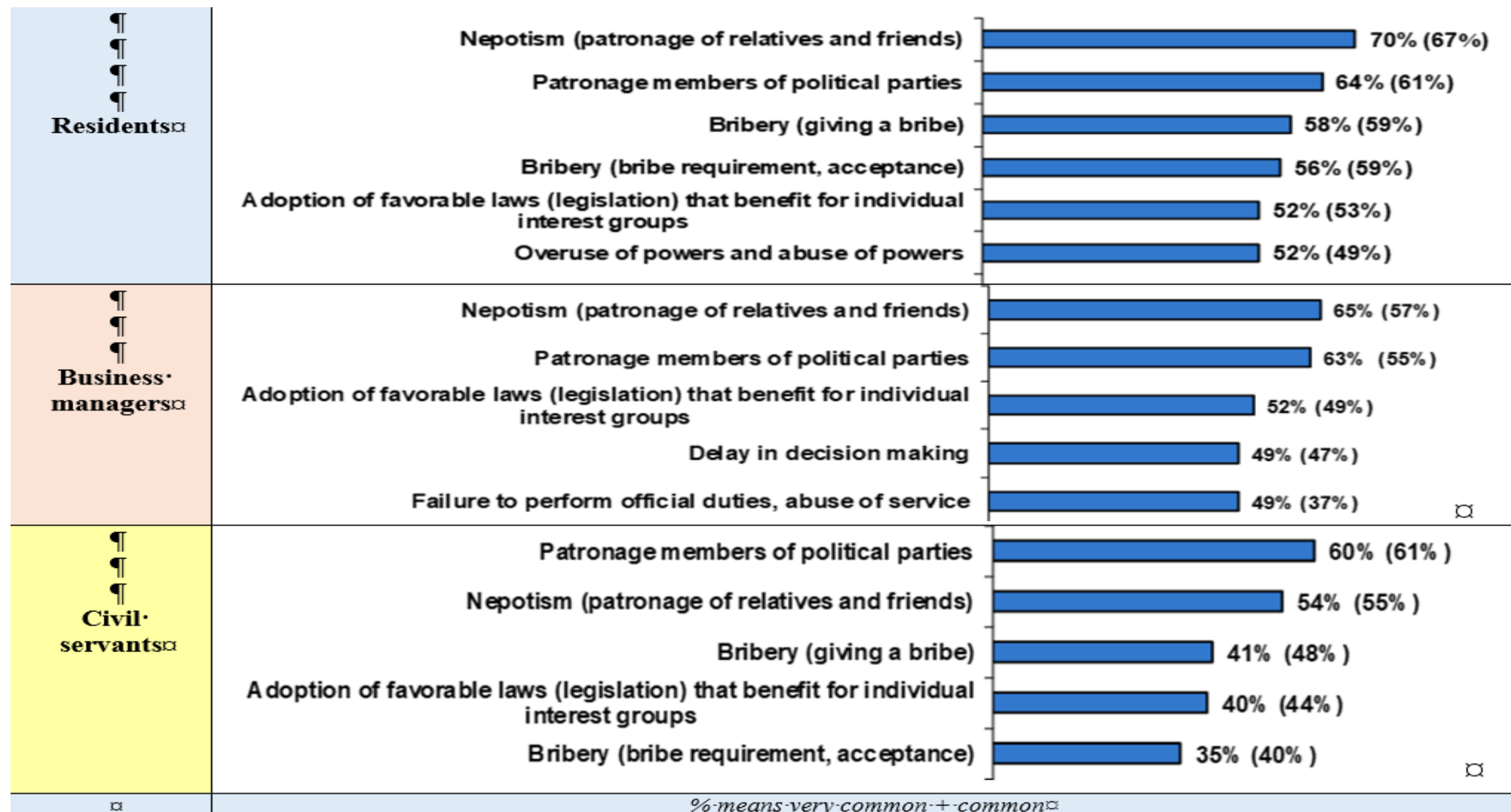

CORRUPTION PREVENTION SYSTEM IN LITHUANIAN PUBLIC SECTOR

Corruption prevention is *detection and elimination of the causes of and conditions for corruption* through the development and implementation of **a system of appropriate measures**, as well as deterrence against corruption-related criminal acts

Complexity of corruption prevention measures

1. Corruption risk assessment and analysis
2. Anti-corruption programmes
3. Anti-corruption assessment of legal acts
4. Provision of the information about a person seeking or holding office at a state or municipal agency
5. Provision of the information to the registers of public servants and legal entities
6. Education and awareness raising of the public
7. Public disclosure of detected instances of corruption
8. Declaration of private interests (not only state politicians, state officials, civil servants, judges, but person who have administrative powers in any public entity)
9. Management conflicts of interest
10. Restrictions or “zero tolerance” mode and etc.

ANTI-CORRUPTION POLICY IN LITHUANIA: GOOD PRACTICE

Reactive

passive/ outcome-oriented



Proactive

initiative/result-oriented

Anti-Corruption awareness raising campaign to all employees of public sector (training)

Compliance officers in all entities of public sector (since 2019)

Specialized sectorial corruption prevention programmes 2016 – 2020 in the fields of the public sector with the highest risk of corruption

- healthcare and social security
- political parties' activities and political campaign funding
- public procurement
- civil service and asset management, etc.

Fixed a **new assessment criteria** of the implementation of the anti-corruption programmes (since 2016)

Development a **new monitoring system** of implementation the anti-corruption measures (2020)

Responsibility for preventing corruption to every public sector organization
/ Top Management

Anti-corruption environment – universal standard to public sector

Art. 29.1.2 of National Anti-Corruption Programme 2015-2025

“To create the **anti-corruption environment** in both the public and private sector; there shall be prepared and published sets of documents facilitating and promoting the creation of the anti-corruption environment and ethical behaviour in the public and private sectors”

Anti-corruption environment

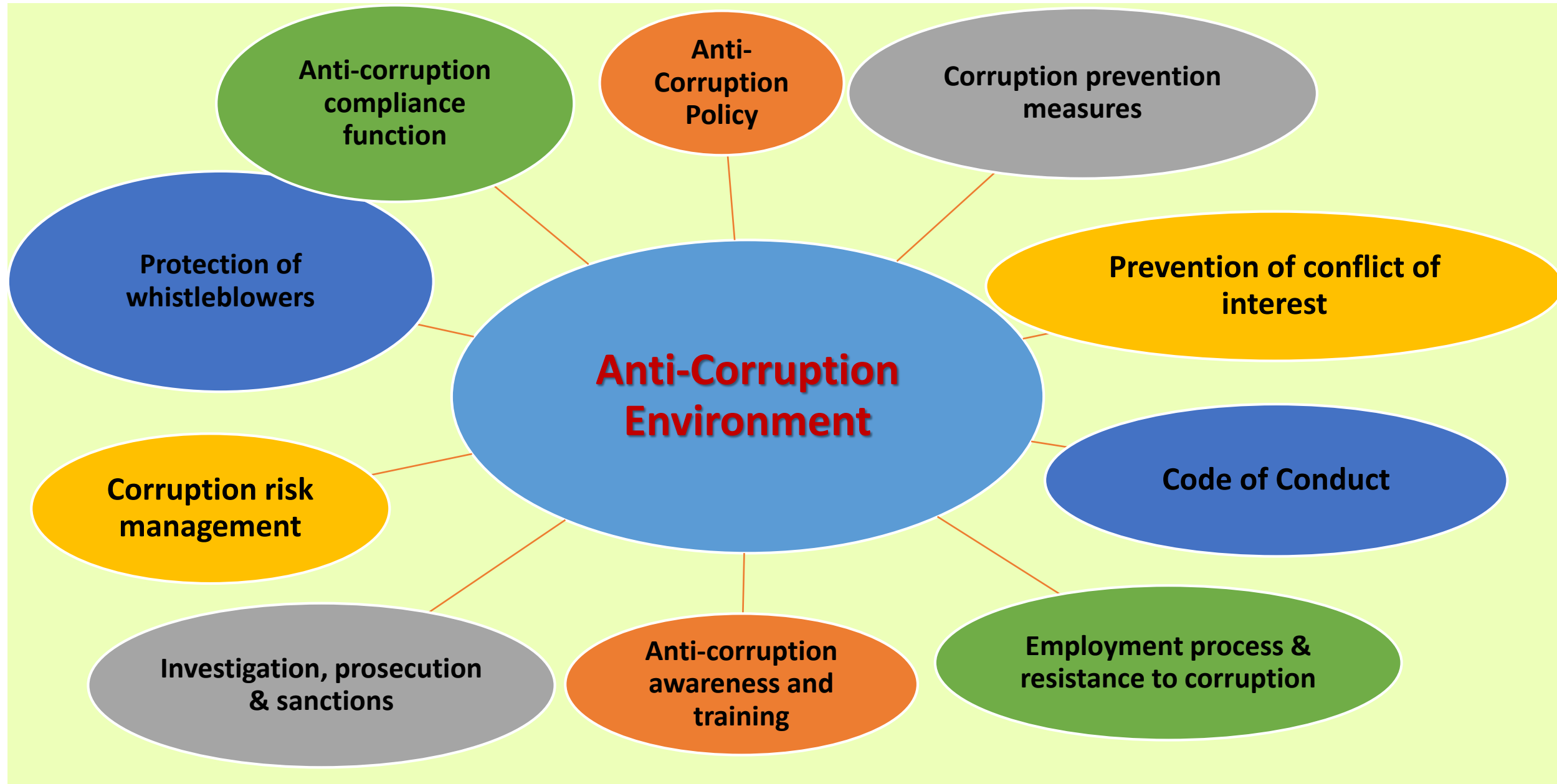
it is a regulatory-based environment in the public sector organization, in which constantly functioning a set of complex measures (pro-active and re-active) designed to ensure resistance (integrity) to corruption by reducing the scope of its prevalence in the organization

Summing up...

1. Every new idea challenged adequate changes... if public sector organization shows aspiration: *to reduce the scope of corruption, increase transparency and openness, accountability to the public and higher resilience to corruption*
2. Not a comprehensive guarantee that there will be no corruption.... BUT...the presence of the anti-corruption environment essentially *creates the conditions and help the public sector organization to implement measures designed to prevent, detect and respond to corruption*

“Sometimes it is necessary to hear the Top managers of public institutions confirming that there *is no corruption in our organization, we do not take/pay bribes, everything works fine in our organization!* Unfortunately, those who saying that, very often *understand the phenomenon of corruption in narrow context*. Where working at least a few people - it does not matter whether it is a public sector or a business - *there is always a space for corruption occur*. Even in high level of public confidence to the public sector, there is a likelihood and risks of sooner or later to face with the manifestations of corruption”
